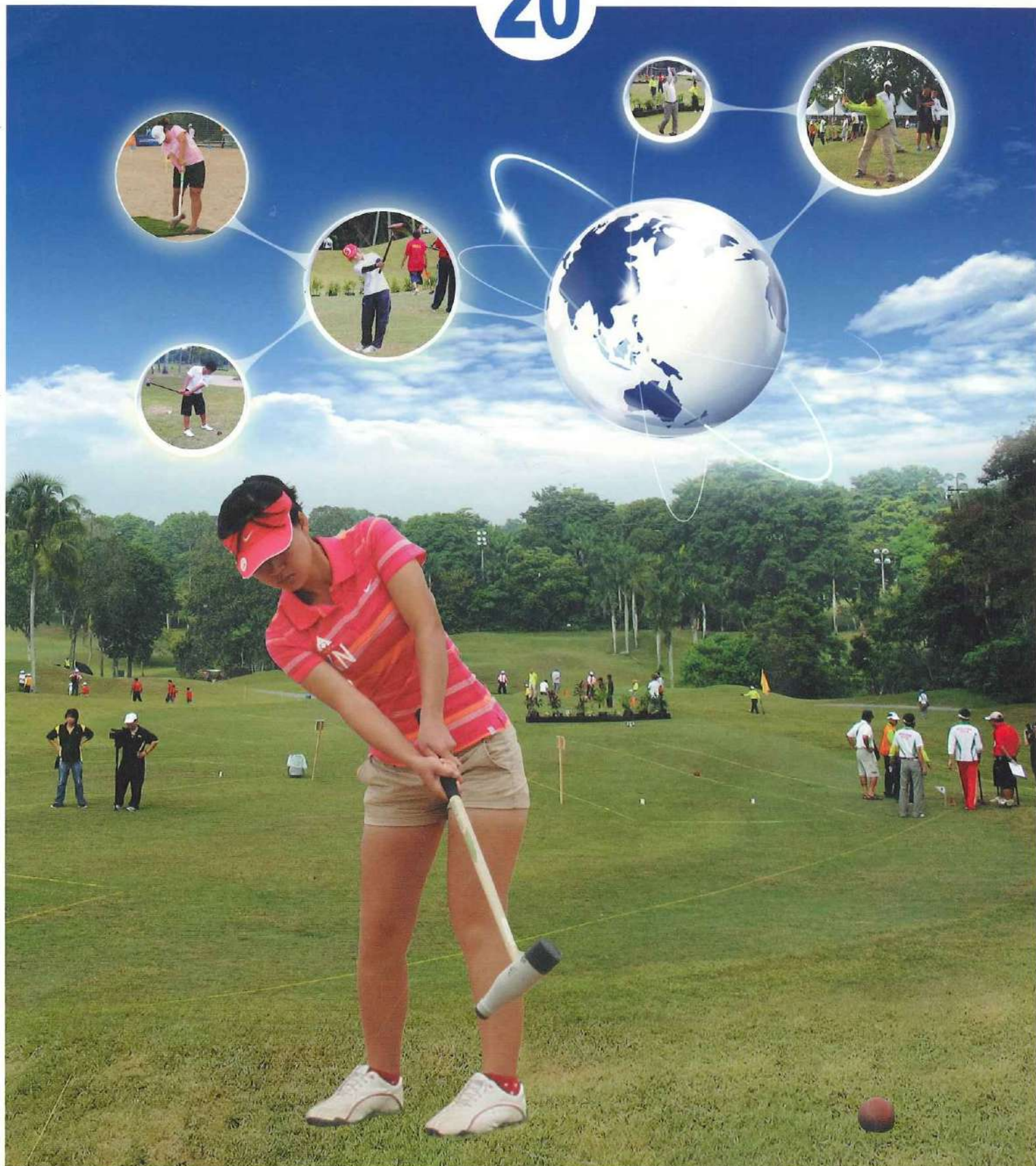

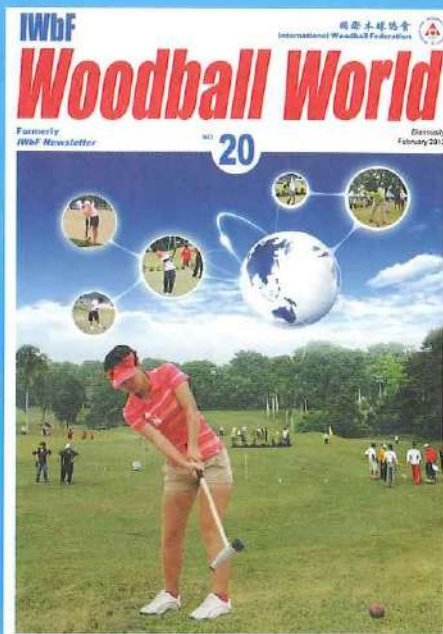

Mainstream sports have been leading by the countries of Europe and America, which mainly are athletics sport. Athletic sport also the sport that Europeans and Americans are adept at or are easily to perform. Woodball sport fills needs for the modern society. It is practical and convenient, which can be played in a wider range of players from young to elderly and men to women. Moreover, Woodball has the functions of "Not only Competitive & Healthy, but also Recreation & Joyful." Consequently, Woodball is able to spread to the five continents and form a global partnership.

We understand that an emerging sport may not be able to have supports from governments until the sport is well developed. Though we are well aware this situation and also conscious that our power is not as

strong as government, we will keep exerting our capability to reach the goal of five-year plan to develop Woodball in Asia and Africa first. Moreover, due to the same reason, winning prize at competitions is requested for practices and also experiences of competitions.

The credit for Woodball development in Asia goes to Asian Woodball friends. All the well developed countries of Woodball are now promoting actively in their nations. They also nurture many excellent and enthusiastic cadres of their organizations. Woodball is well developed in Asia as qualified Woodball equipments are manufacturing and talents are

being nourished. Therefore, manufacturing equipments is always encouraged to countries other than in Asia.

Africa is a new field for sport, which needs more practical modern sport, and Woodball just right cater to the needs of the society. IWbF plans to organize various Woodball workshops in African countries. At present, South Africa, Kenya, and Uganda are developing Woodball and manufacturing equipments. IWbF hopes the Asian countries where has well developed on Woodball are able to support and send players to the 3rd Uganda International Open Woodball Championship 2013 in October in order to encourage the Woodball development in African countries.

It is a natural outcome for Woodball to develop from a merely mass sport to a sport both for leisure and competition. 11th Japan Open Woodball International Championship 2012

第11回日本オープン木球国際選手権大会・雑感

第11回日本オープンは2012年9月29日、30日に、マレーシア、香港、パキスタンからの海外選手を迎え、秋晴れのもとあづま総合運動公園（Azuma Sports Park・Fukushima）で盛大に開催された。

大会は2日間という短期間で、競技も個人戦と団体戦のみの平凡な大会であったが、選手は起伏、長短ありの世界一素晴らしいコースに悪戦苦闘しながらもプレーを楽しんでいた。個人戦の優勝は、男性がNAKAMURA Ryota（IWAKI MEISEI University）、女性がYap Bee Guan（Malaysia）で、団体戦は、男性が日本チーム、女性はマレーシアチームであった。

各国で毎年開催される国際大会の一番の問題はルールである。統一された国際ルールは存在するが、各国の事情によってローカルルールが使用されることである。例えば、OBについてであるが、日本は予算の関係で線審をつけることができない。従って、境界線の外側にボールが転がって、境界線に触れて止まってもOBと見做すことにしている（国際ルールはOBではない）。このOBに関する詳細な説明は省くが、国際木球ルールに「ローカルルール」に関する規定の条項が盛り込まれることを願うところである。

2日目の大会を終え、海外選手は観光、果物狩りに向かった。夜は、ホテルで盛大にさよならパーティーを開催し、国際交流を図ることができた。

翌朝、海外選手はバスで東京観光に向かい、楽しかった福島を後にした。

It was very glad to have participants from Malaysia Hong Kong and Pakistan to participate in the great and successful event of the 11th Japan Open Woodball International Championship 2012 in the refreshing weather on 29 - 30 September 2012 in Azuma Sports Park in Fukushima, Japan.

Although the competition was included two events, Singles event and Teams event, for two days only, players strived to compete with their opponents and also enjoyed the game. Lastly, the champion of Men's Singles event and Women's Singles event goes to Mr. NAKAMURA Ryota from WAKI MEISEI University and Ms. Yap Bee Guan from Malaysia, respectively. Besides, Japan and Malaysia contingents gained the champion of Men's Teams event and Women's Teams event, respectively.

Rule is the biggest problem among

the international championships held in different countries. Although IWbF has the unified basic rule, the rule is slightly different from country to country due to diverse conditions of countries. For example, the definition of out of boundary (O.B.) is distinct between Japan and Rules of Woodball. There is no linesmen serve at the Japan Open due to financial difficulty. Therefore, while the ball rolls out of the fairway along the boundary line. It is considered O.B., which differs from the Rules of Woodball. It has no specific statements of this situation. Therefore, I expect that Rules of Woodball will include the rules worldwide.

After the two days competition, players from oversea went to sight-seeing or picked fruits and had a farewell party at night in the hotel. Next day, they went to Tokyo by a tour bus and finished the wonderful journey in Fukushima.

A solid barrier in all the short-curving fairways was the pioneering devise in the Woodball course design. It created the visible difficulty for the people who did not know Woodball. Also, it was an innovation of barriers to participants. The designed barriers were very good tools to differentiate the ability of players' swing controlling, which were also testing the ability of players' adaptation.

Eventually, the event was a success. Hope to keep on improving from year to year and also look forward to seeing a creation at the 18th Taiwan Open International Woodball Championship 2013 in September.

Calculation for the Points of Stroke and Fairway Competitions of International Tour Woodball Championships 2013

Organizer: International Woodball Federation



I. Calculation Eventt

- i. International Woodball Open
- ii. World Cup, Asian Cup, and Asian Beach Games

II. Calculation Method

i. Stroke Competition

- a. Within each International Woodball Championship of the International Tour Woodball Championships 2013, the organizer will separately select the top 30 male players and top 30 female players to obtain the integration of "Calculation for the Points of International Tour Woodball Championships," and then their scores would be counted the way as followings,

Champion : 30 points
 2nd Place : 29 points
 3rd Place : 28 points
 :
 :

29th Place : 2 points
 30th Place : 1 point

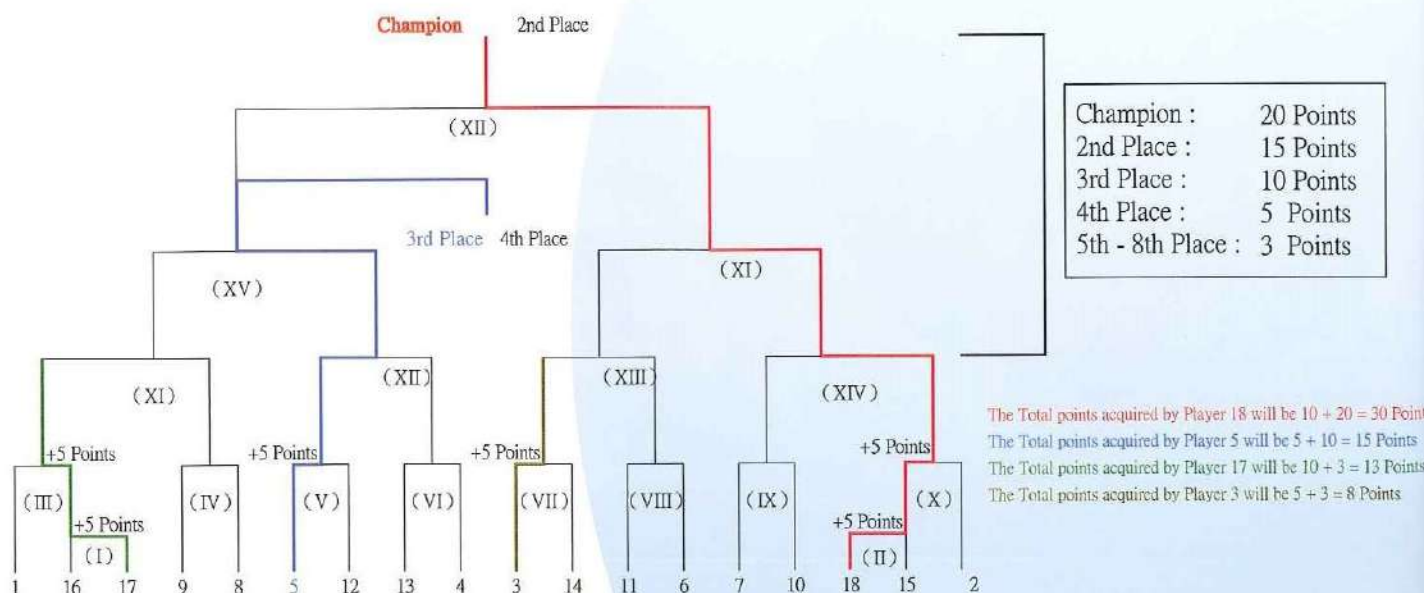
- b. If 2 or above players win the same place or share the same place in the competition, the acquired point shall be the average of the points of the players who succeed the same place or share the same place.

ii. Fairway Competition (Single Elimination)

- a. 5 points acquired for the winning players in each round before Singles Quarter-Final if the total of 16 players or above participate in the event, otherwise no points will be acquired.
- b. The top 8 players in Fairway Competition will acquire points as following,

Champion : 20 points
 2nd Place : 15 points
 3rd Place : 10 points
 4th Place : 5 points
 5th – 8th Place : 3 points

- c. The total points of the winning players should be the sum of the above item a and item b.



III. Points' Multiples

i. Calculation according to competition organizer

The champion delegation's score can be multiplied by 1.5 during an International Open Competition held by the champion nation from the primary international championship competitions like World Cup Woodball Championship, Asian Cup Woodball Championship, or Asian Beach Games of last year.

ii. Calculation according to foreign delegations

For encouraging each nation to host a Woodball open competition by gathering more delegates, the score of the foreign delegations can be calculated as below:
