

親近自然的木球運動－珍惜大地 倡導東方價值觀的體育文化

第二次世界大戰以後雖然歐美少數民族(西歐與北美只佔世界人口的1/10)殖民各地已成歷史。但對體育文化等行為和無形觀念的影響尚存，尤其少數領導階層的崇洋行為和言詞，不知自己民族文化的優點，甚為可議！

觀乎體育世界，幾乎景從西方領導，東方國家體育專業人員藉此坐擁體育資源，政府不惜代價建設場館、培養選手，競逐於歐美設定的體育科舉比賽制度。每次奧運30幾種比賽項目的獎牌金、銀、銅牌各400多面，這些

比賽種類西方高手往往一人可得數面獎牌，東方國家選手偶得獎牌即誇大宣傳為國爭光充分表現弱國心態，甚為可嘆！

木球是以東方文化觀念發展出來的球類運動，東方文化注重的是天人合一，順其自然。木球以天地為場館，美化現成草地和沙灘地為球場，因此沒有兩個球場是一樣的，選手可揮桿於花前樹下或大海邊，有別於冷氣房內的運動和商業化的觀賞體育，也有別於以競技為重的奧運項目。所以，我們的目標不是成為奧運

項目，因為木球具有競技又休閒，健康加快樂的功能而且實用方便，所以我們朝普及全球的目標前進，也鼓舞具有東方特色的體育項目，大膽發展，結合新興國家有識之士，在體育世界和西方分庭抗禮。

木球是現代體育的標竿，木球的發展將促進東方體育世界自主發展。因此，木球運動當前的目標-壯大亞洲，扶起非洲(見NO.20 會長的話)可以跟其他新興體育項目聯合奮鬥。

Get Close to Nature and Cherish our Land - Woodball Sport Advocating Sport Culture of Eastern Values

Despite different areas were colonized by Western after World War II became a history, there are still influences on the sport culture, such as, visible behaviors and also invisible concepts. In particular, it is debatable to see some xenomania have the leadership but have not enough idea about the merits of their own culture.

To view generally, the Western world take the leadership of sports world and the sports professionals of Eastern countries seize the chance to control and abuse the sports resources. The Eastern governments build facilities and training players at all costs all for the pursuit of the competition system established by Western countries. Every Olympic Games,

more than 400 medals each of gold, silver, and bronze of 30 disciplines are awarded. It is easy to see that the Western excellent athletes won several medals. By contrast, Eastern athletes award medals once in a while, it will be exaggerative promoted as the glories of the country. It reveals the weakness of Eastern people, which is lament.

Woodball is developed from the idea of Orient culture which emphasizes the peace between human nature. Woodball can fully implant the usage of the environment as it could beautify the greens and offing. Therefore, every single Woodball course for people to play is unique. Unlike other indoor commercialized sports and Olympic competitive games, Woodball can be played

under a tree or just beside the sea. Our goal is not about being one of the Olympic disciplines, our goal is to develop Woodball sport globally because Woodball is not only competitive and healthy, but also recreational and joyful. Moreover, we would like to inspire those Eastern featured sports to develop with boldness in order to compete with the Westerns.

Woodball is a model of modern sport. The Woodball development will facilitate oriental sports to develop autonomously. Therefore, Woodball is currently aiming to strengthen Asia and support Africa as our goal (refer to Woodball World 20 " President's Message"), which enable to strive together with other emerging sports.

have been enjoying lots of fun and cheers at the Clementi Woods Park Woodball course that manage by WAS.



This year, IWbF planed to have interstate Woodball workshops in Europe, New Zealand, Brazil, and Uganda since May. So far, IWbF completed the workshops in Hungary, Czech Republic, and New Zealand. Next stops will be Brazil and Uganda.

Budapest, Hungary – May

12th Budapest Grand Sport – Selection was the event we participated in as an exhibitor. The event was open for two days for schools, kindergartens, and family. We had a stand and Woodball demonstration to assist students and people understanding Woodball and also

Calculation for the Points of Stroke and Fairway Competitions of International Tour Woodball Championships 2013

Organizer: International Woodball Federation



I. Calculation Eventt

- i. International Woodball Open
- ii. World Cup, Asian Cup, and Asian Beach Games

II. Calculation Method

i. Stroke Competition

- a. Within each International Woodball Championship of the International Tour Woodball Championships 2013, the organizer will separately select the top 30 male players and top 30 female players to obtain the integration of "Calculation for the Points of International Tour Woodball Championships," and then their scores would be counted the way as followings,

Champion : 30 points
 2nd Place : 29 points
 3rd Place : 28 points
 :
 :
 29th Place : 2 points
 30th Place : 1 point

- b. If 2 or above players win the same place or share the same place in the competition, the acquired point shall be the average of the points of the players who succeed the same place or share the same place.


ii. Fairway Competition (Single Elimination)

- a. 5 points acquired for the winning players in each round before Singles Quarter-Final if the total of 16 players or above participate in the event, otherwise no points will be acquired.

- b. The top 8 players in Fairway Competition will acquire points as following,

Champion : 20 points
 2nd Place : 15 points
 3rd Place : 10 points
 4th Place : 5 points
 5th – 8th Place : 3 points

- c. The total points of the winning players should be the sum of the above item a and item b.



III. Points' Multiples

i. Calculation according to competition organizer

The champion delegation's score can be multiplied by 1.5 during an International Open Competition held by the champion nation from the primary international championship competitions like World Cup Woodball Championship, Asian Cup Woodball Championship, or Asian Beach Games of last year.

ii. Calculation according to foreign delegations

For encouraging each nation to host a Woodball open competition by gathering more delegates, the score of the foreign delegations can be calculated as below:





